Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

The NTR Government Degree College, Valmikipuram affiliated to Sri Venkateshwara University, Tirupati, which is situated in hilly rural area, and offers its students coming from humble marginalised communities three years Bachelor Degree in Arts, Science and Commerce under CBCS. College follows a common core syllabus as well as curriculum, prepared by the Andhra Pradesh State Council of Higher Education (APSCHE). The university prepares Annual Academic Calendar and the college follows it strictly. Curriculum is circulated to the staff and students at the beginning of every semester. Semester wise academic plans are prepared and implemented by the staff. Staff meetings are held to review the coverage of syllabus. Study Projects and historical / educational / botanical tours are also organized. All teaching faculties have to upload the details of their daily classwork in the OTLP App everyday without fail. To integrate professional Ethics, gender equality, human values, environment sustainability into the curriculum, the college conducts curriculum reviews of its programme on regular basis. Feedback from the students is collected through online. Feedback is analysed and necessary steps are taken to reach student satisfaction. But the whole process should be more strengthened and effective. Departments of the college organize field trips (curriculum-embedded for the Department of Social Work), Webinars, Student Paper Presentations and Projects to supplement and complement the prescribed curriculum. The IQAC of the College periodically meets to monitor the scheduled time period for completion of syllabus. Role and functions of IQAC should be more highlighted to build an overall academic environment for healthy and robust curriculum design. Academic flexibility upto 20% is made available to the respective universities in the state of Andhra Pradesh.

The institution has a transparent admission procedure. It conducts remedial classes at the commencement of every program for slow learners of second and third-year students to enhance their subject and knowledge. The college conducts bridge / orientation courses for first year students to familiarize them with new concepts. The students are motivated to participate in co-curricular activities, unit tests, assignments, student seminars, quiz programmes, group discussions and debates. In addition to the conventional methods of teaching, the institute supports experiential learning, project based and participative learning with different methods. Students have acquired participative learning experience on current issues. This method also includes groupdiscussion, quiz, role play sessions, etc. The student seminars are conducted in all departments of the college. Students are guided by their faculty on data collection, analysis and report writing. Internal Quality Assurance Cell strives towards qualitative teaching through various constructive policies. Most of the teachers of the college use ICT enabled tools. The institute has Wi-Fi facilities, virtual classrooms, and digital classrooms. Faculty uses virtual class rooms to share or to deliver expert lectures. The College uses LMS to promote elearning and encourages joining online courses. Continuous evaluation is made through assignments, student seminars, Group Discussion, Project Works, Field Visit / Field Work, participation in NSS camps, Clean & Green program. The performance of the students is displayed on the notice board and communicated to the students. There is transparency in the internal assessment. The criterion adopted is as directed by the affiliating University. Mentoring system has been practised in the college and mentors have been identified. Internal test and semester exams are conducted according to the calendar of events prescribed by the affiliating university. Students are given unit tests by the entire teaching faculty for all the semesters. The College adopts outcomebased education rather than input oriented bell-shaped curve of learning. The prescribed mechanism is followed by the institution to communicate the learning outcomes to the teachers and students. In this college program outcomes are assessed and Program Assessment Committee concludes the PO attainment level. At the end of each semester, University conducts end examinations. Based on the result published by university, the course outcomes are measured. Faculties should take special care to enhance the general communicating skill of the students. More teachers to be appointed for the growth of the institution.

NTR Govt. Degree College has been trying to build up a research culture inside the campus. Few faculties have published their research papers in peer-reviewed journals and few have taken up minor research projects from UGC. The Institution has collaboration with universities and has signed few MOUs with other institutions and industries to promote the transfer of knowledge and skills of the students. The college conducts extension activities to promote the institute-neighbourhood community to sensitize the students toward community needs. The NSS units of the college are the most important channel through which the service to the community is planned and executed. Since its inception, the college has two units of NSS with 100 students enrolled in each unit. The two NSS units of the College are involved in the networking of community. In the adopted village, the NSS volunteers have carried out various activities like cleaning the sewage canals, roads, and streets, conduct of health camps for both animals and humans and awareness activities. The student volunteers participated in the Janma Bhoomi - Maa Vooru (A State Government Proposed Program) program. NSS units also conducts blood donation camps every year in the college. To make the society plastic free the students collected plastic in the College campus and on the roads. They created awareness among the uneducated and illiterate villagers on many issues like sanitation of their surroundings, need for being clean and need for woman education. The students have actively participated in the sensitization of villagers to construct toilets. The students of the college worked as volunteers in regularizing the queues during the General elections in 2019 and during the annual festival in the town: "Gangamma Jatara". The college needs to start NCC wing. More linkages and MoUs should be signed with nearby colleges, industries, and other organizations. Exchange of students and faculties may be initiated. Mobilisation of more resources for research need to be explored.

The college has an area of 4.51 Acres of land and a moderate physical infrastructure with the built up area of 3679.52 Sqm. The college has 14 classrooms, Central Library, Reference and Reading Room, Two Computer Labs, Five Science Labs, ELL/JKC Lab, 16 Station multi gym room, two separate staff rooms for Women, Women waiting hall with attached washroom, virtual class room, Career Guidance Cell, Women Empowerment Cell, Seminar Hall, IQAC Room, RO water filter plant, one playground for various kind of games and sports and other amenities for the students and staff. There are 4 LCD projectors, 2 LED TVs, 3 Smart TVs for exclusive use in class rooms. The different departments put together have 116 Computers in all. The college has installed MANA TV Facility a dedicated TV Channel to telecast live lessons to students which are taught by faculty members from different colleges. There is an English language lab equipped with 30 Systems supported by a 7.5KV UPS. Besides, the Jawahar Knowledge Centre was established in the college in the year 2008-09. There 30 Laptops and 30 Tabs in the JKC Lab are provided by the APSSDC. The college has 20 KWP grid tied Solar Power Plant.

The library of the college is partially automated and with nearly 13000 books and other resources. Database of the library holdings are automated with SOUL 2.0 Software in the year 2010 and subsequently whatever books purchased under different schemes are automated. Online journals through N-List is available wherein faculty members and students can access many e-journals and e-books. Reprographic service is also available and students are permitted to take photocopies of study materials. Internet facility is provided to refer to extra study material, journals, and periodicals through websites. The Institution frequently updates IT facilities through IQAC and a committee headed by the Principal, Vice-Principal, and a Senior Lecturer. The committee, IQAC and department of computer applications monitor the internet facilities of the college. Necessary repairs and updates of the systems and other IT facilities are being carried out as and when required. Most of the faculties take classes with IT support. The college has 3 Digital/Smart class rooms equipped with LCD Projectors and internet facility to improve the quality of teaching and learning process. Virtual class room is equipped with an OH Projector and LCD projectors to provide access to online classes and lectures given by subject experts and different lecturers across the state. Sanitary facilities should be improved and more toilets and washrooms be built. Conditions and facilities of the classrooms should be modernised and improved. Hostels especially for girls are needed. Canteen facility is not sufficient. It is in a poor shape

Formal Students' Council do not exist in the college but students' representation in different committees or cells is partially visible. A fair number of students of the college get financial assistance and support provided by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in the form of scholarships and fee reimbursement. Students' Aid fund of the institution is distributed to the economically weaker sections of the students who are not in receipt of any other scholarship. Certain endowment scholarships are also provided to the students who perform well in the University Examinations. The student support system services such as Grievance Redress, Career Guidance, Anti-ragging, Placement Cell, Remedial Coaching, Sports, Gymnasium, and Women Empowerment etc. are established. Value added certificate courses are provided. Coaching has been given to the students for various entrance examinations. The institution helps the students in the placement process through Career Guidance and Counselling cell and Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC). Various skill development programmes are arranged for students by APSSDC. The college has a registered alumni association which incorporated passed out students such as teachers, lecturers, corporate employees, business men, political leaders, media reporters, and police officers and so on. The alumni committee meets twice or thrice a year. They are managing two WhatsApp groups of alumni and share different kinds of information. Alumni should extend its hand in the form of financial assistance for development. Career Guidance or Counselling cum Placement Cell should be more active in the college. The cell should arrange communicative English course, proper job-oriented training, and campus-placement

The institution's governance, leadership, and management practices are intended to help to achieve its vision, mission, and goals. The Commissioner of Collegiate Education, Andhra Pradesh, Vijayawada communicates to the Principal of the institution on different issues in the functioning of the college. At the Institutional level, the Principal communicates the responsibilities to the members of the staff through meetings of staff council, teaching faculty and conveners of the different administrative committees. Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (CCE), A.P. is the apex body about governance, administration, and service matters for all the Government Degree Colleges in the state. College Planning and Development Council (CPDC) exist in the college. The Principal is the academic and administrative Head of the Institution. The teaching and nonteaching staff work together with him for the smooth functioning of the college. Various departments, conveners of various committees and other members of staff are involved in the academic activities of the college. The Teaching and Non-Teaching staff under the chairmanship of the Principal meets regularly and take decisions for the smooth running of the college. There is a mechanism for the performance appraisal in the form of Annual Self-Appraisal Report (ASAR) in the proforma designed by the CCE. It includes the performance in multiple activities like teaching, results achieved, research & publications, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, etc. The Principal periodically evaluates the various service parameters of the faculty in the form of Confidential Reports (ACRs). The overall performance of the non-teaching staff is evaluated by the principal and confidential reports are collected and kept in the college office. These reports are submitted to RJDCE. For service matters of the staff of the institution, Govt Service Rules and UGC statutory rules are followed. The college spends money every year on repairs and maintenance of the capital assets and properties of the college. This college has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in 2007 as per NAAC recommendations and IQAC meetings are held regularly. 85% of the recommendation of previous NAAC cycle has been implemented. However, the IQAC should be activated more to bring quality improvement.

The NTR Govt. Degree College takes measures to ensure the gender equality among college students and staff. They conduct awareness programs every year for boys and girls. The college provides separate toilets for the both genders, separate wash room cum ladies waiting room for girl students. Women Empowerment Cell (WEC) of the college organises special awareness sessions with police department particularly with women staff. They promote the importance of girl education through conducting programs like "Beti Bachavo and Beti Padavo." The college also conducts awareness programmes to students in maintaining good health and hygiene in association with ICDS of local bodies. Students visit their local areas and bring awareness to school girl students regarding nutrition, health and on precautions to be taken during pregnancy. The college also conducts awareness programs on child abuse and women trafficking. The college's WEC organizes seminars with the cooperation of local women and celebrate International Women's Day. Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) have been carried out every year. Internal Green audit is conducted at the beginning of every monsoon season to protect and enrich the green cover on the campus. Plantation activity is carried out in and around the campus with the help and assistance of Forest Department and others. Every Friday is observed as Plastic Free Day and every Saturday as Vehicle Free Day to minimize the pollution in the campus. Greenery has been maintained in the campus with utmost care. The college is harvesting the rain water in pits in the campus. A 20 kW grid connected Solar Power Plant has been installed in the campus so that usage of nonrenewal power is greatly reduced. The college provides equal opportunities and treat all students equally, irrespective of their cultural, regional, linguistic, communal, and socio-economic differences. The college has developed a best practice of ICT Based Learning. The use of ICT simplifies students and staff in the teaching learning process to the great extent by minimizing the hand written documents. The college has set up language lab, computer application lab and IT facilities. A fair number of poor students face some problems in the preparations of allotted digital assignments due to lack of computer and internet skills. Again, many computers with good specifications that are compatible with advanced software applications are required.
